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Principal's Message

Support from families

We have high expectations of all our students so that they are the best versions of themselves. If a student fails to meet our values, it is important that we support them through corrections, so they do not repeat this behaviour. Our system of corrections is very simple, and we are counting on your support. If you are worried about it, the best way to avoid it is to make sure your child picks up the learning habits sticks to them every single day. See page 20 of our Family Handbook (https://www.dixonsca.com/about/family-handbook) for our learning habits.

Research shows that good attendance at school is linked to positive outcomes. Evidence suggests that even small improvements in attendance can lead to meaningful impacts for attainment. Regular attendance is the key to your child doing well and will set them up with good routines for later life and the working world. All parents and carers have a legal responsibility to ensure that their child is educated. School attendance is mandatory during term time with the expectation that attendance will be 100% unless the child is unwell - attendance lower than 90% is of concern and categorised as Persistent Absence. Please support your child's attendance by ensuring medical and dental appointments are made outside of academy hours and that no holidays are taken during term time.

We ask parents to be considerate and safe when parking around the academy. The beginning and end of the academy day is extremely busy, and we ask anyone dropping off or collecting students to drive with extreme caution. Please keep the School Keep Clear marking (zig zags) clear, adhere to local parking restrictions and do not park in front of the gates. As well as being busy outside the academy building, reception can also be very busy at the beginning and end of the day.



Teachers are not always available at these times as we are supporting students in Morning Meeting or in corrections. If a member of staff isn't available, please leave a message with the admin staff on reception and the teacher contact you as soon as they can. However, unacceptable behaviour will not be tolerated in relation to members of staff, including our admin staff on reception. If a parent or carer has concerns we will always listen to them and seek to address them as quickly and positively as possible - we know that students benefit when the relationship between home and school is a positive one.

Unfortunately, we will be saying goodbye to a couple of member of staff this week. After 14 incredible years of commitment and service, Mr Lorryman (Teacher of Science and Head of Careers) will be leaving us. Holocaust testimony virtual reality experience

On Tuesday 10th December, 64 Year 9 students took part in a special event organised by the Holocaust Educational Trust (HET) called Testimony 360. As Holocaust survivors sadly pass away it is ever more important that their stories are recorded for future generations. Because of the innovative work of HET, Year 9 students were able to ask Holocaust survivor Mannfred Goldberg any question they could think of. Althen enabled Mannfred to respond to these questions (he had been filmed answering

every question that could be thought up). Students then were able to use Virtual Reality technology to visit key sites in Mannfred's story, including the coastline in northern Germany where Mannfred was finally liberated, whilst listening to his story. Students were amazed that it was like really being there. Importantly, they gained a deep insight into the life of a remarkable man who said that his revenge on the Nazis was to survive and have a family in Britain.


Future Lioness Leads the Pack!

be like to open their envelopes in the summer of 2025.


OurallimportantYear11consultation evening is booked in the calendar for Monday 9th December 2024. More communications will be sent to parents in due course.


Year 10

What is MyChildAtSchool?

MyChildAtSchool is an online portal that enables parents to view their child's performance at school in real time via any modern web browser (e.g. Edge, Firefox, Chrome, Safari etc.) and for today's busy parents, an app (for android or ios) which offers the same features.

Anytime access to Attendance, Behaviour, Assessment and student reports, letters or important documents. Student timetables alongside the school calendar and fully customisable Exam Timetables and results pages mean schools can keep parents fully informed electronically.

Communication through Push Notification (for the App), Announcements and important documents as well as enabling parent messaging to the school are all included features. Schools can engage parents with their child's homework through the homework settings and they can use the Parent Evening bookings section to book or view their appointments.

If you haven't signed up to the MCAS App, please can you do this by Friday 31 January. All communications to parents after this date will be through the MCAS app rather than by text. Download the app from App store for apple mobile phones or Play Store for Android phones. Once you have downloaded the app, request a password reset and then you will have access to attendance, timetable, appreciation / behaviour data as well as cycle reports and exam timetables for GCSE and cycle 3 assessments.
